Treasurer's Report for the financial year ended 31 December 2021

Having been appointed to the role of Treasurer at last year's AGM, I would like first to thank David Kingsmill for his sterling efforts in having acted as the Society's Treasurer for the immediately preceding 10 years. The Society was most fortunate in having David devote so much of his time and attention to the Society's financial affairs.

During the 2021 financial year most financial activity of the Society was associated with Wolds End Orchard. An early decision of the new Committee was to set up an additional bank account through which all orchard related financial transactions would be conducted and thereby enable it be easily seen that the orchard activities were self-financing. I am happy to be able to confirm that the WEO bank account has consistently since its opening been in credit without needing to be topped up by any transfer of funds held in the Society's main account. In fact, as can be seen from the receipts and payments page of the 2021 accounts, orchard related expenses of just over £3,500 were comfortably exceeded by donations, grants received and apple juice sales totally just over £5,000.

The Society made one grant in its own right during 2021 which was a grant of £500 towards the funding of the Campden History Society's planned further archaeological research in respect of the Campden Town Hall.

I am pleased to be able to report that the Society's cash held position of approximately £8,500 as of 31 December 2021 is approximately £2,000 higher than the position as of the beginning of the year.

I am most grateful to Mark Kirkbride for having kindly acted as the Society's independent examiner and the efficient and timely manner in which he performed such role.

I will be pleased to receive any questions which members may have in relation to the 2021 accounts and do my best to respond to the same.

COMMITTEE'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2021

The Committee is pleased to provide this report and the accounts of the Society for the for the year ended 31 December 2021.

As the Society is a registered charity, the members of the Committee are considered to be the Society's charity trustees for the purposes of the Charities Act 2011. Pursuant to such Act, the Committee is required to prepare an annual report and accounts of the Society.

The Society was formed in 1970 as an unincorporated association pursuant to a Constitution which has been amended from time to time, most recently in July 2021.

As an unincorporated association with an annual turnover which does not exceed £250,000, the Charities Act allows the Society's accounts to be prepared on a receipts and payments basis consisting of an account summarising all money received and paid out by the Society in the year and a statement giving details of its assets and liabilities at the end of the year. Such an account and a statement for the year ended 31 December 2021 (together with comparative figures for the financial year ended 31 December 2020) will be found later in this document.

The Society and the separate registered charity The Campden Conservation Trust Fund ("CCTF", which is a charitable trust formed in 2002 pursuant a Declaration of Trust which was amended in July 2021) are treated as "linked" charities by the Charities Commission with the consequence that the Society, as the "reporting charity", is able to produce one set of accounts which cover both the Society and CCTF. Consequently, in addition to the account and statement relating to the Society, this report and accounts also contains an account and statement in relation to CCTF for the year ended 31 December 2021 together with consolidated figures.

The Society is established for the public benefit for the following purposes:

- to secure the protection of the architectural and historic quality of Campden, its open spaces and its natural setting;
- to promote high standards of planning, architecture and landscaping in Campden;
- to stimulate interest in and concern for the character and beauty of Campden;
- to promote awareness of the climate emergency, to push for zero carbon solutions and to protect terrestrial biodiversity, within Campden.

In the context of the above objects, 'Campden' means the town of Chipping Campden, the village of Broad Campden and their surrounding areas.

In light of the Society's objects and its activities and the Committee's policy that no unfunded expenditure should be incurred at any time, the Committee does not believe there is a need for the Society to maintain a reserves policy.

The Committee confirms that it has complied with its duty to have due regard to the guidance on public benefit published by the Charity Commission in exercising its powers or duties.
