PLANNING & CONSERVATION MATTERS

A new Neighbourhood Development Plan Working Party was formed last month and has met twice already to agree how to take the process forward with some urgency. The group comprises Mark Benson (Chair), Patrick Spink, Michael Haines, and as a non-Town Council member, David Roberts. Other members of the public may well be asked to help in specific areas; and The Campden Society has confirmed its willingness to help where it can provide the necessary skills or expertise. The key drive of the Working Party is to get the Neighbourhood Development Plan approved as soon as possible and to that end they hope to put a draft up on the Town Council website as soon as possible.

We have recently alerted Cotswold District Council to what we think may be a breach of planning laws for a change to a property that we don't believe has had Listed Building Consent. We urge owners of listed buildings to check on the Historic England website for details when considering changes to their property. www.historicengland.org.uk.

QUAKERS' MEETING HOUSE

Just a reminder that you can visit this fascinating building and enjoy a cup of tea and slice of cake on Sunday afternoons in July. The Meeting House is a cottage built of local Cotswold stone and was converted in 1663, extended in 1677. The relatively early date is evidence for a substantial Quaker presence in the area during the second half of the C17th. During 1874-1961, it was used for a range of different purposes, including as a Baptist church hall before being restored as a Meeting House. The interior retains a historic stand and some panelling. The Broad Campden Meeting House will be open throughout July on Sundays 2-5pm. All welcome including dogs.
