PLANNING & CONSERVATION MATTERS

We have worked with - and supported - Cllr Gina Blomefield's endeavours to investigate the on-going issues arising from the **Olympick Drive** development, including the flooding of the pathway between the new estate and Littleworth.

We also support the **Planning Committee's review** which has been conducted by Cllr Paul Welford. His report tracks the alignment of the Committee's submitted recommendations over the past year and the eventual decisions by Cotswold District Council. For further details, please go to the Town Council's website and search for the Planning Committee documents associated with 23 January 2023.

Turning to the **Neighbourhood Development Plan**'s progress, the Working Party has sought input from the relevant authorities on regulatory and statutory aspects of the plan and the required process in order to help ensure that the absolutely critical public consultation is framed and undertaken as effectively and transparently as possible. This has necessitated a slight delay in launching that public consultation – which will hopefully be in March.

We encourage everyone to submit individual views about planning applications and local strategy to Cotswold District Council. They are currently conducting a short digital survey on their Housing Strategy to collect views on their approach. This can be found via their website.
