PLANNING & CONSERVATION MATTERS

Good progress has been made on the draft Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP), which is planned to be issued for public consultation on Monday 8 April. The consultation period will last 6 weeks. During this period, the full NDP will be accessible on-line and hard copies will be able to be held for reading at specific locations e.g. at the library. The NDP is important; it guides, but does not determine, all planning decisions relating to land use in the area. It should therefore reflect the views of all stakeholders in the neighbourhood. Accordingly, we strongly urge all residents to respond to the consultation; your opinions need to be taken into account in the process of finalising our NDP. To assist Campden Society members in this respect, we will be issuing further communications in a Members' Newsletter early in the consultation period. We do not intend to provide standard wording for responses, but rather to help you develop your own responses by providing additional explanation of the NDP policies, their consequences, and why they might be important to you.

The Campden Society continue to monitor planning applications for properties in the Chipping Campden and Broad Campden area. In particular, we look at the impact on the surrounding environment, neighbouring properties, potential flooding, parking, traffic flow, the commercial viability, and the heritage of the town.

We encourage everyone to submit individual views about planning applications and local strategy to Cotswold District Council. They are currently conducting two short digital surveys: one is on their Update of the Local Plan designed to make it "green to the core" and the other on the Cotswold Design Code which invites comments on Lady Juliana's View, amongst other recent housing developments. WOLDS END ORCHARD

'Bringing In'. If you have been keeping an eye on the Orchard, you might have seen recent activity cutting back some of our veterans. We are lucky to have two experts who are taking on the essential work of 'bringing in' the older tree, where the spread of the branches can become too much in stormy weather when laden with fruit. This process is cutting back the longer branches thereby bringing the centre of gravity and fruiting area closer to the trunk, and is helpful in prolonging the tree's life. We have some grant funding from Cotswolds National Landscape to pay towards employing these experts, who are also taking on the more dangerous high-level work that volunteers cannot do.
